

Michal Bar-Asher Siegal is a professor in the Goldstein-Goren Department of Jewish Thought at Ben-Gurion University of the Negev. She is a scholar of rabbinic Judaism focusing on aspects of Jewish-Christian interactions in the ancient world. Dr. Bar-Asher Siegal was an elected member of the Israel Young Academy of Sciences and has served as a visiting professor at both Harvard Law School and Yale University. Her first book is *Early Christian Monastic Literature and the Babylonian Talmud* (Cambridge University Press, 2013; winner of the

2014 Manfred Lautenschlaeger Award). Her second book is *Jewish-Christian Dialogues on Scripture in Late Antiquity: Heretic Narratives of the Babylonian Talmud* (Cambridge University Press, 2019; finalist, National Jewish Book Award, 2019).
